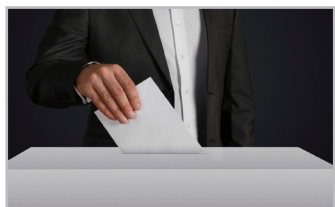
In-Person Sunday Services
